11. After WW II, Steinbeck moved to this city permanently. Its nickname is The Big Apple.

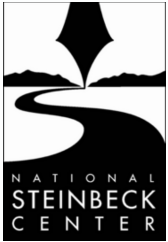
Why is John Steinbeck So Famous?
